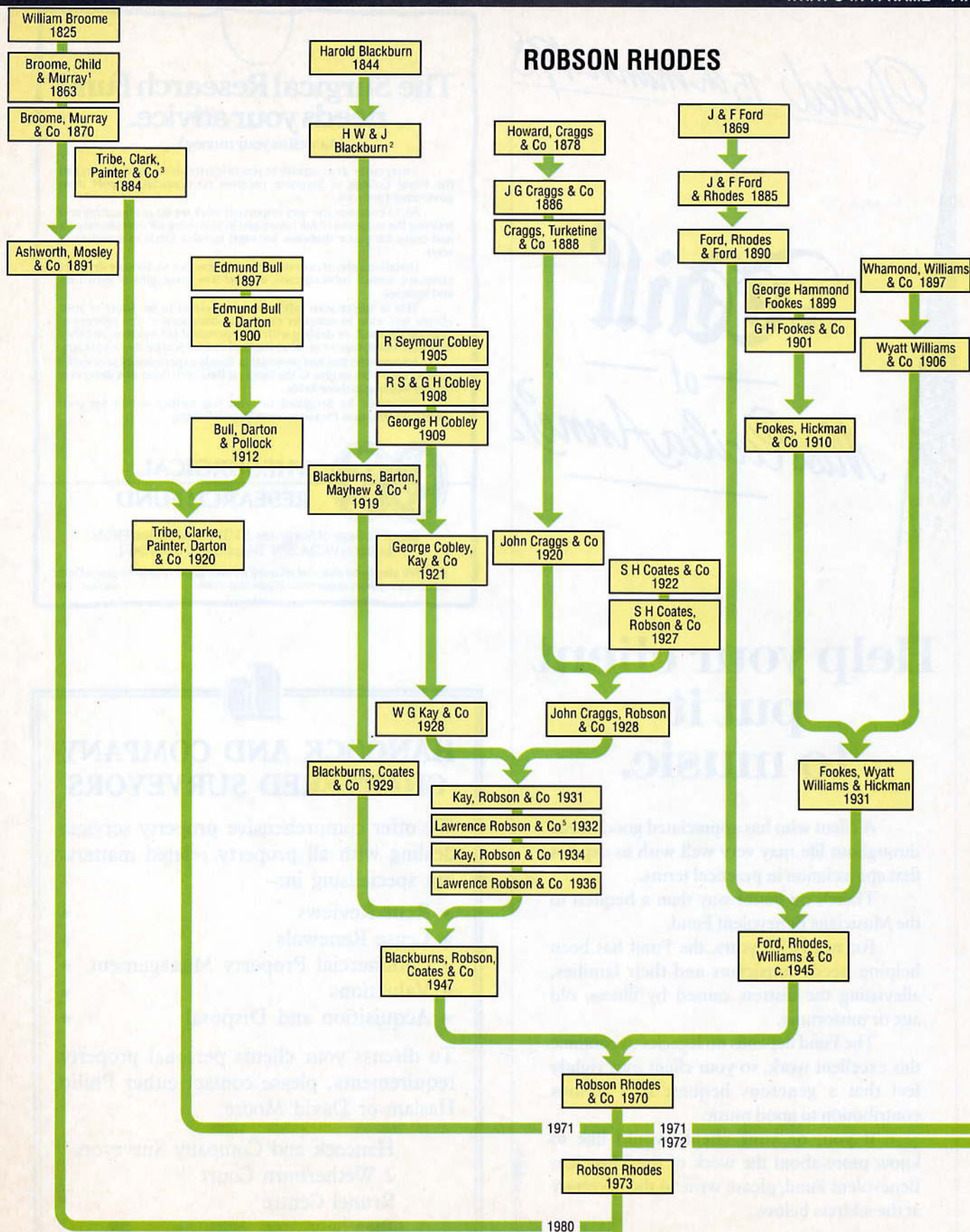


ROBSON RHODES



Notes

1. Adam Murray was a founding member of the Manchester Institute of Accountants in 1871. He was the joint author with Roger Carter of the first text book on income tax.
2. John Blackburn was a member of the first Council of the ICAEW. His son, J H Blackburn, was a member of Council for a record 51 years.
3. Tribe, Clarke & Co was founded in 1780 in

Bristol and this office merged with Deloitte Haskins & Sells in 1969. The London office, under the style Tribe, Clarke, Painter & Co, was opened in 1884.

4. Barton, Mayhew & Co, after subsequent mergers, became part of Ernst & Whinney.
5. Lawrence Robson was president of the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants 1950-51.

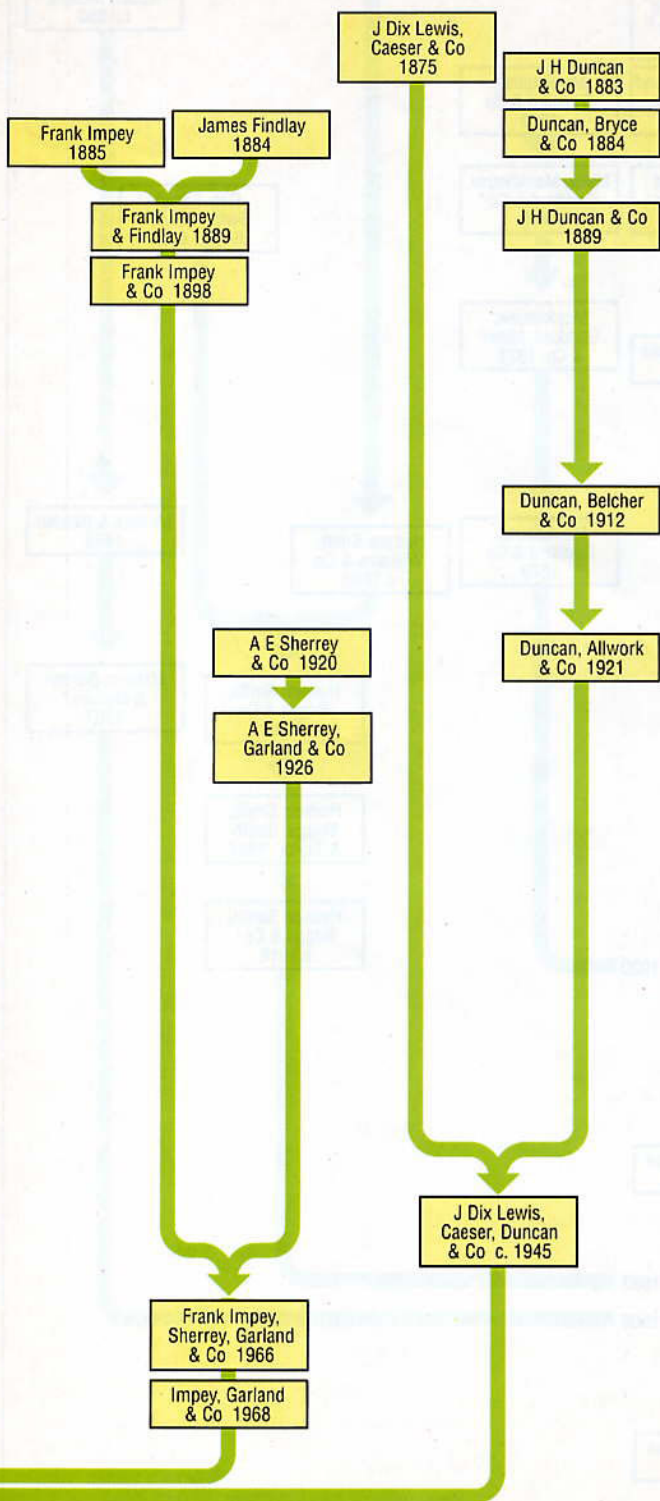
