John Mann, senior, was a founding member of the Institute of Accountants and Actuaries in Glasgow, 1853, and its president 1906-09. He was the last survivor of the original members on his death 1910.

Alexander Thomas Niven was a founder member of the Society of Accountants in Ediphyrich.

Charles Fitch Kemp was a founding member of the Institute of Accountants in London, 1870, and a member of its first Council. He was a member of the first Council of the ICAEW and its president 1894-96. His son, Harold Fitch Kemp, was president 1930-31. was president 1930-31.

Thomas William Read was a prominent member of the Incorporated Society of Liverpool Accountants, 1870, and its secretary 1872-83. He played an active role in the formation of the ICAEW and was a member of its first Council.
