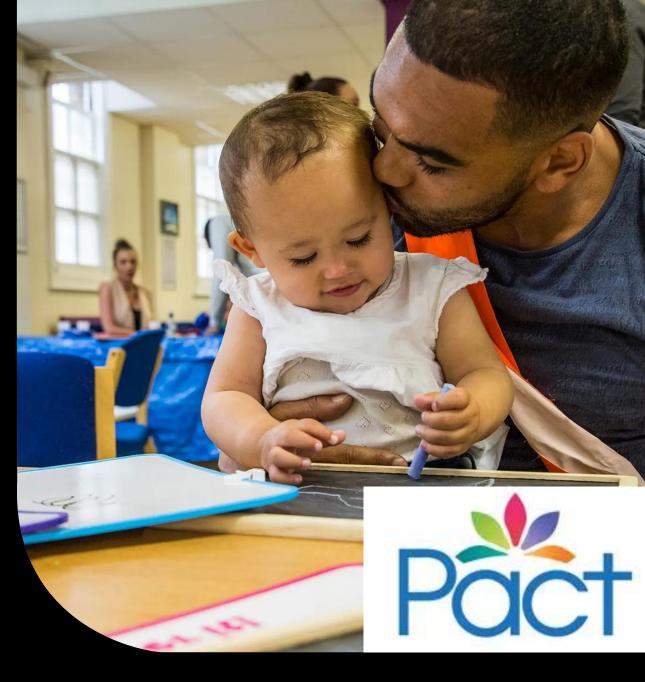

How the funding ecosystem works for non-profits

In the UK, nonprofits access grants from a broad ecosystem including government, Lottery distributors, trusts, and regional partnerships.

Navigating the grant landscape means knowing what matters to funders and where your work fits into their goals.

What to know:

- Most funders focus on impact, equity, and sustainability
- Grant calls often reflect national priorities like cost-ofliving, climate, or digital inclusion
- Local Enterprise Partnerships (LEPs) and councils offer place-based funding





Types of Grants Available

Capital / Local Grants



For capital expenditure typically to stimulate employment

Most often distributed regionally

Direct to local LEP/Growth Hub

Innovation Grants



For new and unique R&D projects with wider impacts

Typically distributed nationally

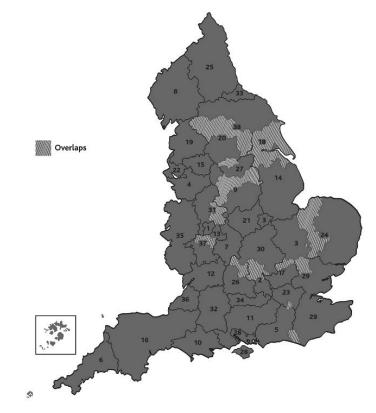

Local Enterprise Partnerships

England is divided into 38 different local authorities called Local Enterprise Partnerships, better known as LEPs.

LEPs are good to be aware of if you are searching for grants as these partnerships have their own pool of grants, other funding and training opportunities which must be allocated to businesses in the given area.

Other Local Support Systems

Local Enterprise Partnerships are specific to England.

In Wales the local support system is "Business Wales".

While support to Scottish businesses is delivered through <u>Business Gateway</u> and the support for businesses located in Northern Ireland is mainly delivered through <u>Invest NI</u>.





Eligibility Explained

Legal Entity - NFP

You must be a recognized non-profit such as registered charity, Community Interest Company (CIC), or equivalent. Funders need to ensure compliance, accountability, and that funds support public benefit.

Mission

Your organisation's purpose should align closely with the goals of the funder.

Example: a grant focused on youth mental health should support projects working directly with young people.

Financials

Grant-givers want to see clean, current financial records, budgets, and ideally audited accounts. This shows you can manage funds responsibly and deliver value for money.

Delivery

Your project should demonstrate a considered approach and the readiness to put plans into action. Funders need to trust that the work will be carried out effectively and lead to lasting impact in the community.



Tips for applying



Timing. Ensure you are applying at an appropriate stage and have a clear opportunity to take advantage of. New funds open all around the year, so make sure to check Swoop's grant finder on a regular basis for new grants you may be eligible for.



Define the opportunity and make sure you are eligible and fit the scope for the specific grant. It is easy to spend time applying for grants which are not suitable for your business.



Have a defined project and outline and highlight the impact it'll have to align with the scope. Make your application worthy of receiving funding by ensuring you have done all the necessary preparation.



Outline the costs involved in the project and ensure you justify why they are needed and how much is needed to cover these costs.



Share your objectives clearly. Make sure you are clear what success looks like as a result of taking on a small business grant. How will you know when you've got there? What economic and social impact will your project have?



Outline a timeline and projections of progress expected to be achieved as these will be monitored closely if you are successful and mentioned within the scope.

Using Grants to Drive Organisational Growth

- Launch a new programme aligned with your mission
- Hire for roles that drive long-term impact
- Improve service delivery or expand reach
- Digitally transform systems to reduce admin or increase efficiency

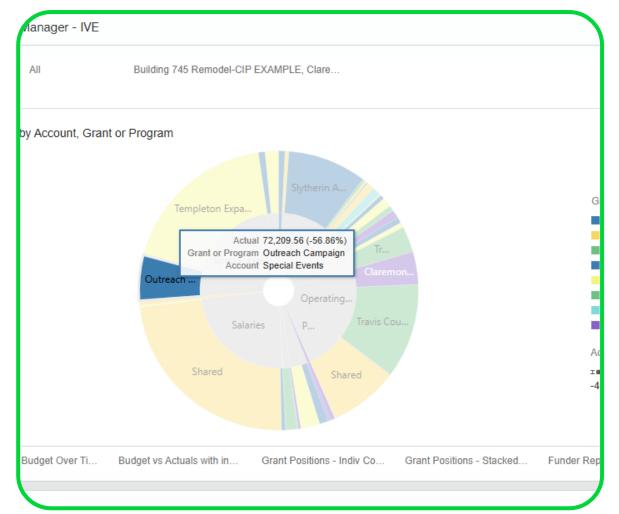

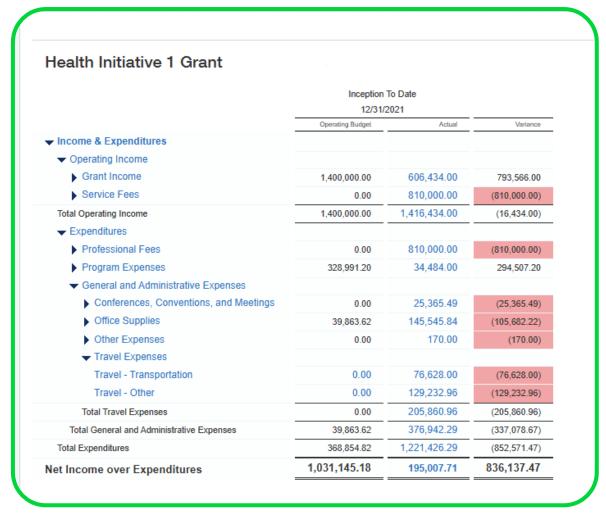

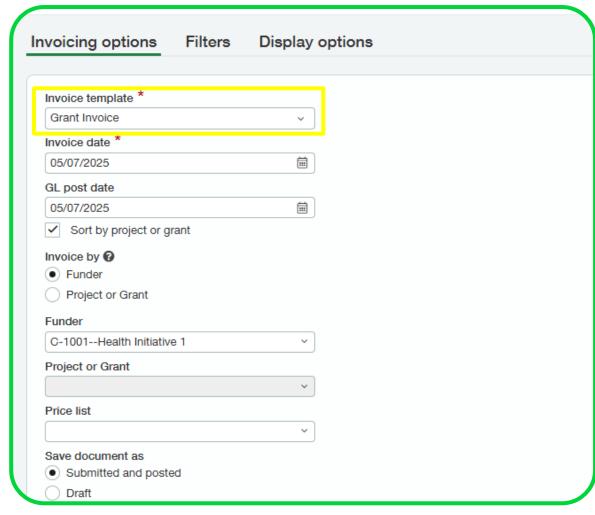


Graphical overview: All Grant Expenditure

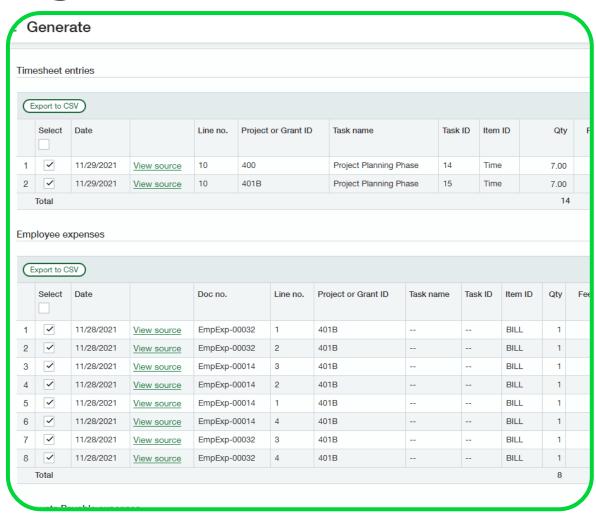
Detailed Reporting: Actuals vs Budget by Grant



Detailed Grant reporting



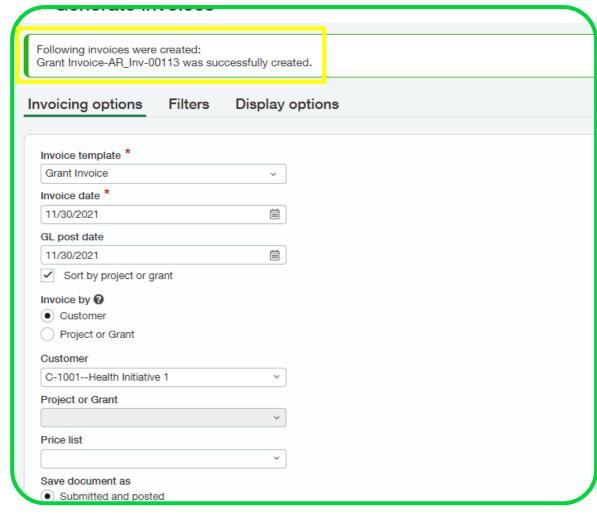

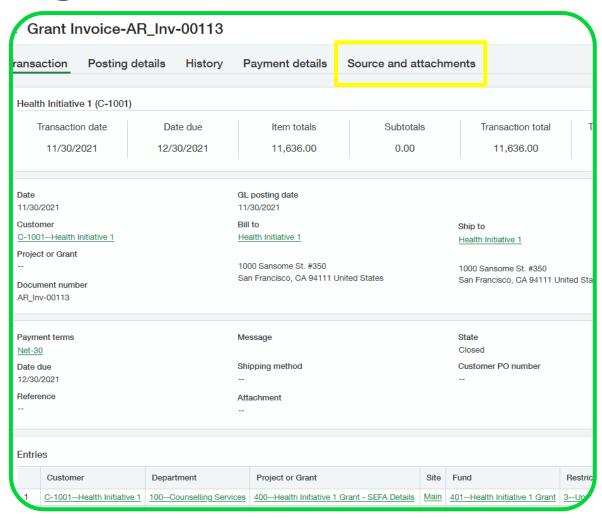
