In addition to the above, the Officers of the Society, the immediate Past President and a member of the Council of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales, who are also members of this Society, are members of the Committee.

Review of the year

Income from courses was down by 53% in 2018 to £9,589, with a reduction in costs by 65%, resulting in the net income reduction of 10%. to £3,907. The reduction in course revenue and costs was due to the committee's focus on key courses and the introduction of the Institute's "Practitioner's Essentials" commission process, which provided a net income of £540 in the year. The Society has very little income other than from courses and an ICAEW contribution of £1,500 to cover the Society's administration and other costs. The LANSCA District Society's strategy to continue to focus on topical update courses, whilst managing loss making courses, has help ensure funds are correctly allocated.

In 2018, there was no Society Annual Dinner held and a £2,000 grant received from the Institute has been deferred for a future event. The president's travel costs remain consistent, however part of the Institute's deferred income have been released in the year.

The combination of the decrease in net income from the courses and the movement in various costs, have helped in a surplus in income over expenditure for the year of £3,824.

Risk review

The Committee examines the major risks that the Society faces each financial year. The Society has developed systems to monitor and control these risks in order to mitigate any impact they may have on the Society in the future.

Reserves policy

The Committee has agreed that the reserves of the Society will only be used for the benefit of members. The reserves should not fall below £20,000 or rise above £50,000. If during a financial year it is forecast that the year-end reserves will fall outside these figures, a short to medium term action plan will be prepared to remedy the situation. This plan will require the approval of the Committee. This policy will be reviewed annually.

Responsibilities of Officers and Committee

The Officers are responsible for preparing the accounts in accordance with the Society's rules.

The Society's Rules require that the Officers prepare accounts of the Society for each financial year. Under the Society's rules, the accounts are required to be examined by an independent accountant and copies made available to members.

In preparing these accounts, the Officers and Committee have:

- selected suitable accounting policies and applied them consistently;
- made judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- followed the recognition and measurement requirements of applicable UK Accounting Standards; and
- prepared the accounts on a going concern basis.

The Officers are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the Society. They have a general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the Society and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.
